

ANNUAL REPORT 2016-2017



I take great pleasure in presenting the Annual Report of All Saints' College for the academic year 2016-2017. The report briefly recounts the highlights of the year and is a record of the milestones crossed by the management, staff and students in their quest for excellence.

Honours, Awards & Recognitions

The jewel in the crown has been the re-accreditation of the college with 'A' grade by NAAC. The threemember peer team led by Dr. Ratan Lall Godadara, Vice-Chancellor, Hemchandracharya, North Gujarat University visited the college on 8, 9 and 10 August 2016 and commended the institution on the friendly relationship between stakeholders, on its excellent cultural and extension activities, on the effective leadership of the governing body, on its confident, dedicated faculty and support staff as well as the peaceful and conducive campus, the good work ethic and discipline.

Eight of our students secured ranks in the University exams. The first, second and third rankin B.A. History went to Ajiya A, Abshana Jamal and Neethu Maria

James respectively. Greeshma P Rajeev secured the first rank in B. Sc. Physics. The third rank in B.A. Communicative English, B.Sc. Botany and B. Com. (Finance) went to Akhila Anil, Arya M R and Aswathy R V, respectively. Aditya S Kgot the third rank in M.Sc. Environmental Sciences.

Our students also excelled in sports at the National level. Junitta J S of DC II Economics won the gold medal at the National Taekwando Club Championship. Meera S Kumar of DC II B.Com (Finance) got the Silver medal at the National Karate Championship organised by the Karate Association of India at New Delhi.

Six students won the National gold medal for Pasepallo, a variation of baseball: Maria Justin Mathew of DC III B. Com. (Finance), Merlin V Boban and Sruthi RS of DC II Chemistry, Sahithya S R of DC I English, Malini M Nair and Aswathy M S of DC II Communicative English. Of these, Maria Justin Mathew, Merlin V Boban and Aswathy M S have been selected to join the Indian camp for participation in International competitions organised by the Finland

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Pasepallo Association. The College Cricket Team secured the third prize in the Inter-collegiate Cricket Tournament on 23 September . Two students from our college were selected for the All India Inter-University competition.

The efforts of our creative and talented faculty brought recognition and honour to our institution. Dr. C. Udayakala, HOD of the Department of Malayalam was the recipient of two awards for her creative writing this year–the Panchami Sahitya Award for Writing on 29 December 2016 and the 131st Govinda Rachana Puraskaram of Navarasam Sangeetha Sabha for her anthology of poems titled Ottamancherathu on 18 February 2017. Her three books Otta Mancherathu, SayanthanathileMazha and Chinthanilavu had been released at the Press Club in August. On 7 November, another book by Dr. C Udayakala, Ekanthatha Oru Symphony was released by Shri. Binoy Viswam, the former Forest Minister.

Dr. Sreedevi S. was awarded the Hindi Sahithya Purasakar by the Kerala Hindi Sahithya Academy and the Hindi Bhasha Shreshta Puraskar by the Allahabad Sahithya Sammelan. This is the sixth award for her literary work.Dr. Reshma J K implemented the best practice of preparing Skill and Career Portfolio for PG students in Environmental Sciences. A centre under FLAIR named Student Scholastic Support Hub (SSSH) was initiated by Dr. Ayona Jayadev with a view to support PG students in Environmental Sciences in extra-curricular scholastic activities. A digital library of the Department of Botany was officially inaugurated by the librarian of our college, Sr. Nirmala on July 2016. An Instrumentation room was set up by the Department of Zoology in July.

All Saints' College got registered in the network of institutions participating in the Outreach programme conducted by the Indian Institute of Remote Sensing, Department of Space, Government of India. Dr. Smitha Asok of the Department of Environmental Sciences was nominated as the Programme Coordinator for conducting the programme. She was also elected as the Joint Secretary of the Executive Committee, Indian Society

2 of Remote Sensing, Kerala Chapter.

Dr. Caroline Beena Mendez HOD of the Department of Physics is a member of the Board of Studies. Dr. Reshma J K, HOD of the Department of Environmental Sciences was appointed as a member of the PG Board of Studies, University of Kerala.

Research Guides

Dr. Kavitha N, Department of English was granted guideship by the Standing Committee of the Syndicate on Academics and Research, University of Kerala on 16 January 2017. Dr. Deepa Mof the Department of Physics, has produced 1 PhD, and has 2 PhD research scholars currently working under her. Dr. P S Anjana of the Department of Physics has 4 PhD research scholars under her guideship.

Academic Activities Training Programmes Organised

An Orientation Training Programme on ENVI Software was conducted for the faculty and students by the Department of Environmental Sciences in association with ESRI, India. The Department of Environmental Sciences in association with Matprop Technical Services Private Limited organised a oneday training programme, 'Save Water Campaign 2017' and also signed an MoU for undertaking collaborative research ventures in future.

The Scholar Support Programme was successfully carried out in the college with the whole hearted cooperation of the management, Principal, staff and students. The SSP orientation class was given to the firstyearstudents on 20 September 2016. The purpose of the programme was briefed to the students by the SSP coordinator Ms Celina James (Department of English). The class helped the new scholars get the

Based on their marks in the qualifying exams, 150 students from the selected streams were enrolled in the programme.

The first phase of the programme had a total of 10 working hours. Faculty members from the identified subjects were able to instil an interest in the students through group discussions, interactive classes, lectures, assignments and tests. The second phase of the SSP had a total of 10 working hours.
