Principal's Report 2017-2018

It is with great pleasure that I stand before you to present the report of the activities of All Saints' College. The college has been a hive of activities this past year and has made great strides in terms of knowledge and quality advancements. We have made remarkable progress in the arenas of social contributions and in improving the teaching learning experiences.

Taking off from where the previous year ended, the Candle lighting ceremony of the last year saw Father John, A. R., Director, Ministry of Family, Archdiocese of Trivandrum, presiding over the function. Father spoke about the necessity of compassion and the importance young women must give to empowerment, both financial and social.

The college is run by the sisters of the Congregation of the Carmelite Religious and is honoured to welcome as its new manager, Rev. Mother Mary Frances and her new general team. Mother Frances had been a student, faculty member and Principal of the college. She had served as Mother Superior and Manager earlier too and we are indeed delighted to have her back with us.

The progress an institution makes can be measured by the progress those associated with it make, keeping that in mind I am pleased to announce that Ms. Cinthya Christopher, Department of Botany, Margret Leena V., Department Physical Education, Ms. Vidya Nair Dept. History and Political Sciences, were awarded Ph.D. degrees in the current academic year. On behalf all present here, I extend my hearty congratulations to them.

Among the student community, Ms. Anjaly Nair of Communicative English secured the First Rank in the Kerala University Examinations.

We are indeed proud of our students and hope they make rapid strides thanks to the opportunities that life will certainly present them with.

The college and its faculty have been active participants in the process of knowledge building. We have in the past year, been very vocal presences in the academic community. There were six National training programs as well as seminars organized by various departments of the college in the academic year. One International Seminar and several invited talks by experts were also organized. We had international resource persons coming in and addressing these occasions, thus providing a very enriching experience for our students and faculty. The teaching faculty of the college also participated in and presented papers at conferences. Members of the teaching faculty attended 71 seminars. There were 17 papers presented at various seminars. The faculty has made commendable number of paper publications. There are as many as 75 publications in high impact, peer reviewed International and National journals and periodicals of repute. Dr. Cinthya Christopher, Dept. of Botany, wrote a chapter in a book published by Kerala State Biodiversity Board. And Dr. Ayona Jayadev from the Dept.of Environmental Sciences published a chapter in a book published by Research India Publication.

The Dept.of English is an approved Research Centre with the University of Kerala. There are three research guides with a total of eight research scholars attached to the centre at present. Seven members of the teaching faculty of the college (Dr. Nisha K. K., Dr.Sr. Shaina T. J., Dr. Reshmi R. Prasad, Dr. Kavitha N, Dr. Deepa M, Dr. Anjana P. S., and Dr. Smitha Asok V.) are research guides. There are a total of 31 Research Scholars utilizing the research facility of the college.

Ms. Lekha Rani M. L., Dept. of History and Politics, Ms. Divya S. R., Dept. of Physical Education and Ms. Sonya J. Nair, Dept. of English, submitted their doctoral theses. Most of our teachers are engaged in research and we hope to see a lot more of doctoral degrees being awarded in the near future.

In a commendable achievement, Dr. Smitha Asok V. of Dept.of Environmental Sciences has two ongoing Major Research Projects funded by Space Applications Centre, Indian Space Research Organization, Ahmedabad and Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment with a financial ceiling of Rs. 20, 22,000 and Rs. 13, 35,785 respectively. The Department also has two Student Projects supported by Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment, with Dr. Ayona Jayadev and Dr. Smitha Asok V. as principal investigators. This is indeed a very rare achievement. I congratulate the department for this tremendous work that they have put in.

Our faculty has been held in high regard by other institutions for their organisational, administrative and intellectual capacities. Dr. Sr. Shaina T. J. and Dr. Reshma J.K. are serving as members of the Board of Studies of Mar Ivanios College and PG Board of Dept.of the University of Kerala respectively.

Dr. P. S. Anjana of the Department of Physics is a visiting faculty of Institute for Intensive Research in Basic Sciences (IIRBS), offering MS Programme and Integrated Ph. D. Programme, MG University, Kerala. Dr. Veena Suresh Babu of the Dept.of Physics is serving as the Co- ordinator, IGNOU study Centre of All Saints' College. A number of teachers have set question papers for various universities and colleges this year.

Ms. Mary Alice G. is the chairman of the II and IV semester BA Economics exams of the University of Kerala 2017-18.

Dr. Reshmi R. Prasad and Dr. Srilekha Nair have been functioning as the Chief Superintendent and the Senior Assistant Superintendent respectively of the University examination.

Dr. Veena Suresh Babu of the Dept.of Physics and Ms. Divya S. R of the Dept.. of Physical Education are the Superintendents of the various exams conducted by the Kerala Public Service Commission.

Dr. Reshma J.K. was the Faculty-In-charge of Internship for M.Sc. Environmental Science students with Matprop Technical Services Pvt. Ltd. Dr. Ayona Jayadev, Dr. Smitha Asok V & Smt Rajani V. of the same department were awarded certificates of merit for also serving as faculty Co-ordinators. Dr. Ayona Jayadev was also invited for judging the Children's Biodiversity Congress – 2017. Dr. Smitha Asok V. & Smt. Rajani V. were awarded a Certificate of Appreciation for acting as Academic Consultants in the study of water resources, as part of Environmental Literacy Project of Kerala State Literacy Mission Authority, Thiruvananthapuram. Dr. Cinthya Christopher of Dept.of Botany has served as an examination expert for the Kerala Public Service Commission, Government of Kerala.

Dr. Beenakumari K. S. Served as the resource person of 'Water Quality Training Programme' organised by 'Jalasamridhi Kattakkada Mandalam Programme in association with CCDU at Panchayat Hall, Vilavoorkal on 12th June, 2017. The teachers of the Dept. of Physical Education distinguished themselves at the intercollegiate Athletics meet held by the University of Kerala. Ms. Divya S.R and Dr. Margaret Leena came First and Third respectively in the 100 metres race. Ms. Divya also came first in Shot Put.

Our teachers have been tirelessly working in order to remain up-to-date about the various advancements in their respective fields. They have attended Refresher and Orientation courses in places ranging from Kariavattom to Mysore, JNU, Pondicherry and Ahemadabad. Three teachers attended Refresher Courses, while two faculty members attended Orientation courses and two teachers went for the Special Summer School. Dr. Smitha Asok has also undergone training for using the MOODLE- a means of online course design and delivery. Dr. Ayona Jayadev is on the editorial board of several accredited research Journals. Our teachers have been equipping themselves with additional training and certifications so as to better discharge their academic duties. Dr. Beenakumari. K.S. of the Dept.. of Chemistry served as reviewer in a number of journals.

On the cultural front, Dr. C. Udayakala, the Head of the Malayalam Dept.,

won three major awards this year. Samskara's Grandhapuraskaram - 2017, Bharath Sevak Samaj's (BSS) Poetry Award - 2017, and the Nadam Kerala's Writer of the Year-2017 award.

The students of the college were just as impressive in showcasing their talents. They participated in various intercollegiate events and functions of national importance and brought laurels to the college.

The various clubs and associations of the college were proactive in their work and helped keep the atmosphere of the college charged up and vibrant.

All the associations and clubs were inaugurated by personalities who garnered fame and merit in their respective fields.

The associations pushed for activities that raised awareness for social and environmental causes- two themes that resonate with the ideals of this college. As part of the efforts to effectively enable first year students to the demands of the collegiate system, we organised an Orientation and Bridge course under the aegis of the Dept. of English. The Orientation course helped the students understand the legacy of the college and also about the ways to mentally condition oneself to meet the challenges that life may throw at them. The Bridge Course aimed to bridge the gap, the students from various boards may face when they enter the college. The students are brought up to speed on the basics of English Language and Grammar. This was conducted as a four- day programme.

Biodiversity Club

Under collaboration with the Kerala State Biodiversity Board, a Biodiversity Club is functioning in the college, the main objective of which is to carry out programmes for conservation of local biodiversity in accordance with the Sate Biodiversity Acts. Board has sanctioned the prestigious 'Santhisthal' project to All Saints' College in which initially, 15 cents of land in the campus was set aside for making a wood-lot with Rare, Endangered and Threatened (RET) species. As part of the Club activities, about 350 saplings were obtained from different agencies such as Kerala Forest Department and Kerala Gandhi Smarak Nidhi and plantation activities had been carried out since its inception in 2012 onwards till the current academic year. As part of activities of the club, Dr. Smitha Asok V organized an International Special Lecture on 'Theoretical and Practical Introduction to SAR Remote Sensing' by Dr. Vishnu Nandan, Post Doctoral Researcher at the Cryosphere Climate Research Group, University of Calgary.
