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PDP: 'Capacity building in Outcome Based Education(OBE): Teaching Methods '

An professional development programme on 'Capacity building in Outcome Based Education(OBE) : Teaching Methods' was conducted for the teaching staff by Mr. Sabin Govind (Assistant Professor, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences) on 07.04.2022 from 10am to 1pm in the Audio Visual room. Welcome address was given by Dr. Liji Varghese

Outcome-based education is an educational theory that bases each part of an educational system around goals. By the end of the educational experience, each student should have achieved the goal. There is no single specified style of teaching or assessment in OBE and classes, opportunities, and assessments should all help students achieve the specified outcomes. The role of the faculty adapts into instructor, trainer, facilitator, and mentor based on the outcomes targeted. OBE can primarily be distinguished from traditional education method by the way it incorporates three elements: theory of education, a systematic structure for education, and a specific approach to instructional practice. It organizes the entire educational system towards what are considered essential for the learners to successfully do at the end of their learning experiences. It focuses on the following skills when developing curricula and outcomes: life skills, basic skills, professional and vocational skills, intellectual skills, interpersonal and personal skills.

The resource person explained that capacity building to minimize an over-reliance on outside experts as sources of knowledge, resources, and solutions to community issues and to foster a sense of ownership and empowerment, so that community partners gain greater control over their own future development.

The session gave an insight to Strengthen confidence, skills, Knowledge, and resources and lead to more feasible and appropriate community solutions than approaches that lack a capacity building focus. Meeting came to an end at 12 pm. Dr. Soniya J Nair proposed the vote of thanks.

REPORT

PDP: 'OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION' ON 17.3.2022 [ONLINE MODE] Organized by IQAC, All Saints' College

The IQAC of All Saints' College organized a Professional Development Programme on 'Outcome Based Education' on 17 March, 2022 through online platform for the teaching staff. The session was handled by an eminent speaker Dr. Kevin S, (Former Pro Vice Chancellor of the University of Kerala and Emeritus Professor in the Department of Commerce, University

of Kerala). The session started at 10 am and concluded by around 11.30 am.

The speaker started his session with a simple definition for Outcome Based Education, (OBE) which is the education in which an emphasis is placed on a clearly articulated idea of what students are expected to know and be able to do, that is, what skills and knowledge they need to have, when they leave the campus. He explained about the basic principles of OBE- Clarity of focus which means that everything teachers do must be clearly focused on what they want students to know, understand and be able to do, Designing down, High expectations and Expanded opportunities. OBE empowers students to choose what they would like to study and how they would like to study it. Not only does it adapt to a learner's strengths and weaknesses, but it also provides sufficient time to attain proficiency and fluency in the subject matter. There are several advantages to having course learning outcomes including: setting shared expectations between students and instructors, helping students learn more effectively and providing clear direction for educators when making instruction and assessment decision.

Dr. Kevin explained that the focus on outcomes creates a clear expectation of what needs to be accomplished by the end of the course. Students will understand what is expected of them and teachers will know what they need to teach during the course. With a clear sense of what needs to be accomplished, instructors will be able to structure their lessons around the student's needs. OBE does not specify a specific method of instruction, leaving instructors free to teach their students using any method. Instructors will also be able to recognize diversity among students by using various teaching and assessment techniques during their class.Student involvement in the classroom is a key part of OBE. Students are expected to do their own learning, so that they gain a full understanding of the material. Increased student involvement allows students to feel responsible for their own learning, and they should learn more through this individual learning.Other aspects of involvement are parental and community, through developing curriculum, or making changes to it. OBE outcomes are meant to be decided upon within an



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educational system, or at a local level.

As an end note, Dr. Kevin expressed his view in the sense that the parents and community members should give input in order to uphold the standards of education within a community and to ensure that students will be prepared for life after their educational period. The session ended with an active interaction with the participants and Dr. Kevin was quite interested in clarifying doubts from the participant's side.

PDP: INITIATIVES ON QUALITY ENHANCEMENT (28.01.2022)

Organized by IQAC, All Saints' College

The Professional Development Programme on the topic 'Intiatives On Quality Enhancement' was organised by the IQAC of All Saints' College on 28.01.2022 at Audio Visual Room at 10 am. The session was handled by Dr. Joseph I. Injodey (Former Executive DirectorExecutive Director/Principal, Rajagiri College of Social Sciences and Director, Rajagiri Centre for Business Studies)

Dr. Joseph Injody explained that the Quality Initiative is intended to allow institutions to take risks, aim high and learn from only partial success or even failure. Enhancement is a process of improvement. In relation to higher education quality, enhancement may refer to individual learners when it means improvement of the attributes, knowledge, ability, skills, and potential of learners and the improvement in the quality of an institution or study programme. Quality of classroom teaching provides a solid foundation for quality education. Quality teaching is linked with effective and efficient teaching practices and knowledge. It depends upon the quality of university teachers and their professional development. Quality of facilities and effective classroom practices play a significant role in promoting quality teaching. Higher education institutions should care about the quality of teaching and learning and they need to take extra care to maintain the quality of teaching and learning.

Contributing to national development has always been an implicit goal of Indian higher education institutions. For human resource development and capacity building of individuals, the role of higher education institutions is very significant. Dr. Joseph Injodi explained about some examples of innovation in education like Competency-Based Learning, Video Streaming/Flipped Classroom/eLearning Trends, Open Curriculum, Changing nature of faculty, Changing revenue sources for institution funding, Digital textbook etc. He also mentioned about some of the important dimensions of quality education that every organization should meet and they are equity, sustainability, contextualisation and relevance, balanced approach, child-friendly teaching and learning and learning outcomes.

Dr Joseph Injody expressed the importance of quality enhancement and said that



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that the activities of a typical higher education establishment should contain three distinct areas and they are Administration, Education and Research. We should be able to acheive the overall goals which includes include universal access and retention, bridging of gender and social category gaps in education and enhancement of learning levels of children. If the intention is to improve the quality of basic education in the country, there is a need to provide adequate classrooms, teaching aids, and water and sanitation facilties.

There are guiding principles of continuous quality enhancement and the improvement should be continuous and incremental. All employees should identify the opportunities for improvement. The goals must be clear and aligned and the standards are necessary, but always changing. Through quality education, an individual can seek better job opportunities, progress with sustainable livelihoods, and have a healthy lifestyle. Best delivered education spurs innovative minds. Well-educated masses can tolerate the resilience of the communities and become a part of a peaceful democratic society.

The programme concluded with Q and A session by around 12 noon and that was an informative and interseting session.

The workshop on 'Digitally Enhanced learning' was a one-day session headed by Mr. Kevin Raj S.J, Senior product trainer, Senses Electronics PVT ltd, Pune on 11th December 2021. 'The pandemic has further propelled the need to depend more on digital platforms to make a learning environment that is interactive and responsive for both students and teachers. The session began at 9:30am and lasted till 1:30 pm.

The speaker began the session by briefly discussing the need and the use of a creative learning space in a time as such where physical classrooms has replaced online classrooms and the need to keep the students engaged in their lessons and to reinforce the concepts better to the students. Then the speaker expounded further on their product, its uses and how it can benefit the students. Smartboards helps in enhancing the learning interface. They act as interactive learning devices, with a touch-sensitive surface. The product is extremely user friendly and helps in creating a creative interface. The smart pen helps in digitalizing written text and stores them for future use. The screens are compatible to be used as an android device as well as a P.C. It Can also be connected to laptop via HDMI Can be connected to Android phone via mirroring / casting the smart screens are Wi-Fi enabled Can help to browse while teaching thus helps in adding additional information to the teaching resource Can copy paste / embed web pages onto blackboard. Blackboard feature can be enabled with a tap. This feature also helps in creating a more animated and connected lessons. Another feature explained was the use of videos to explain concepts along with the use of a blackboard it serves a split screen function too thus the speaker emphasizes that the new era of smart learning enables a Learner-centric Style of Teaching with Better response to Learning Style and helps in Teaching larger sets of children with ease

The session then continued with a demonstration of the product by the speaker who instructed the various features virtually. The session proceeded with the teachers volunteering to try out the panel. There was also a Q&A session and most teachers did practice sessions and cleared doubts regarding the functioning of the panel. PDP: 'IIQA & SSR PREPARATION UNDER REVISED ASSESSMENT AND ACCREDITATION

(14 December, 2021)

Organized by IQAC, All Saints' College

The PDP on 'IIQA & SSR Preparation' was a one-day session headed by Dr Gabriel Simon Thattail, Director, IQAC, University OF Kerala on 14th December 2021. The workshop aimed at providing guidelines for the preparation of documents and data for the NAAC accreditation. Since the University Grants Commission has acclaimed NAAC accreditation mandate, and as a determining factor to help assess and authenticate their quality standards.

The speaker started the session by addressing the norms of NAAC and on the efficient preparation of documents. He stated that NAAC gives an opportunity for colleges and universities to understand their strengths, work on them, realize their challenges and in total provides a valuable self-assessment as well as a broader analysis of themselves. He further elaborates on NAAC's procedure of analyzing documents which is straight forward and it overlooks on the submission of Self Study Report (SSR) and the Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA). But now with the new revision, they also ensure the inclusiveness of Student Satisfaction Survey, Data Verification, and Validation that augments the whole objective of the NAAC.

The speaker also further briefs upon the procedure of accreditation. NAAC completes its accreditation in three levels respectively: Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA) and Self Study Report (SSR), Data Validation and Verification (DVV) and Pre-qualifier Score / Preparation towards Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS), Onsite Assessment - Peer Review by Visiting Teams. He further elucidates more on IIQA AND SSR. The procedure begins with the registration followed by the payment of fees as well as several documents are to be submitted online this is completed in the IIQA stage the portal opens twice a year and this procedure takes up to 15 days for approval. He also explains on SSR, here they can upload they submit data with both Quantitative and Qualitative metrics, upload relevant documents and select non-applicable metrics. He concludes by stating that, the IIQA&SSR thus form the basis of NAAC accreditation process.

The session concluded followed by a Q&A session, where the speaker answered the questions raised by the participants.

REPORT

PDP: ETHICS IN HIGHER EDUCATION: NEW LEARNING IN THE AGE OF THE PANDEMIC (In Association with Global Ethics) (16th of December 2020)

Organized by IQAC, All Saints' College

The PDP on 16th of December 2020 was conducted by the IQAC, All Saints' College. The session was conducted by Dr. Indukuri John Mohan Razu, consultant and Research Fellow of ACTS (Academy of Higher Education), Bangalore and former Professor of Social Ethics at the United Theology College, Bangalore. The session lasted from 9.30 to 10.30.

One of the most important things the COVID-19 pandemic did perhaps was it taught men to adapt and adjust to any situation, however horrendous it may seem. Along with all the other areas such as healthcare and the food industry, it also vastly affected the education sector as well. Innovative methods of education and tools for its implementation were introduced. The pandemic created a new hybrid education paradigm which gained popularity. The traditional concept of education is dwindling as the world learns to adapt to new systems of imparting knowledge. India is a country with a very rich past. It is also home to what is perhaps one of the oldest systems of education in the world – the Gurukul System. Under this scheme of things for several generations, students have traditionally engaged in the pursuit of knowledge while living along with the instructor or guru.

Dr. Razu began his session by describing the challenges of online learning. Educators are under pressure to develop new strategies which engage the attention of their students and keep their focus on the less. One popular tactic used by today's teachers is the inclusion of visual learning tools to aid the process of education. Another tool employed by teachers today is personalized learning. Further emphasis on student input fosters a far more involved and active engagement of the student in the ultimate task of learning. With the increased use of online tools, A.I powered testing systems ensure that students and teachers are able to track the periodic progress and thereby identify and tackle methods of combating lapses in the learning curve.

Another major tool now in operation is the Internet of Things. This aids in the creation of personalized dashboards for students, parents and teachers which helps keep track of assignments, projects and the positions of individual students in relation to the class. This helps track and improve the progress of each individual child.

The speaker further spoke about the online experience of learning which brought about a severe lack of soft skills in children. Colleges must teach students how to interact with and manage people. In the modern scenario of online learning, this is instituted through such mediums like video calls which help students connect easier with their teachers and also aid in keeping them focused on their targets even amid this confusion. A major tool utilized today is hybrid learning which mixes the approach of the traditional on campus classroom with the online learning portals.

The pandemic has taught man to adapt to the circumstances before him however taxing they may seem. It taught us to appreciate the wonders of Nature. These are the values that must be inculcated in the generation which we are molding. The session ended with a Q and A where the speaker answered the questions raised by the participants.
