The College begins functioning in the Holy Angels' premises on 6 July 1964 with Miss Margaret P. Paulose as Principal and 277 students in the First Year Pre-Degree class. On 15 May 1965 His Excellency the Most Rev. James R. Knox, Apostolic Internuncio to India lays the foundation stone of the first block of the College at Chackai, the permanent campus. The College is shifted to the new campus at Chackai on 10 January 1967. It is upgraded on 24 July 1980 with the introduction of Degree

Courses in English, History, Economics, Mathematics, Chemistry and Zoology.

Now our college is one of the premium institutions in Kerala , accredited with top ranks in various fields of academic explorations, dedicated to creations of dynamic young generations, leadership and commitment to make a difference in today's changing world. Quoting Plato - 'The beginning is the most important part of the work'.



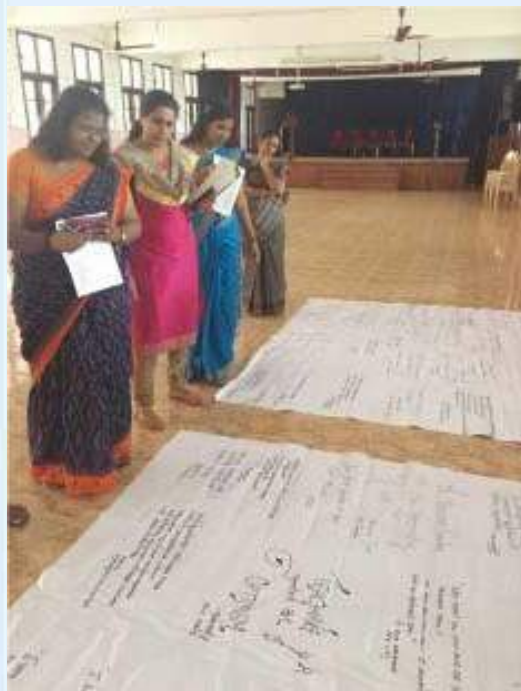

Out of the more than 100 cultural/literary events that were held, All

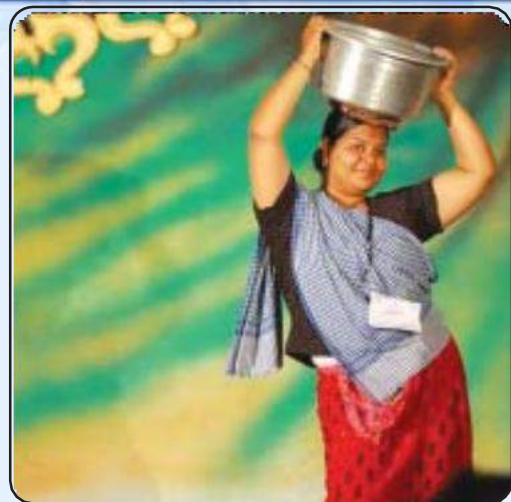
