The webinar on "Inclusive communication: The Nouns and Pronouns of Everyday Speech" was conducted on **27th August, 2021.** It was jointly conducted by the Young Communicators Club and the Gender Equality Club All Saints' College. Dr. Sonya J. Nair, Head of the Department of English, All Saints' College invited the resource person, **Mr. Vihaan Peethambar** who is a trans advocate, queer feminist, diversity and inclusion professor based in Bangalore. He was awarded the 2020 Diversity and Inclusion Champion of Change award by Community Business. He also serves as an expert committee member in India's first national council for transgender persons. Participants of the session included dignitaries like Dr T. Vinay Kumar, National President of PRCI and Ram C Menon, Director of PRCI-YCC Kerala chapter, Dr Sonya J. Nair and Ms. Kukku Xavier, faculty co-ordinator. The webinar focussed on **Inclusive communication** and especially the use of inclusive pronouns that play a really important role these days. He also talked about addressing people respectfully by using gender neutral terms. The session was highly insightful. The webinar was open to all the YCC members of Kerala and approximately 60 people were in attendance. The program lasted for 1hr 45min.

Webinar 2

'Interviews to Inclusion: The Corporate Way' 25th September, 2021

On September 25th, 2021 at 11:00 am the Webinar on the topic 'Interviews to Inclusion: The Corporate Way ' was organized by the Young Communicators Club of All Saints' College and held under the supervision of Ms. Kukku Xavier, Faculty Co-ordinator and Dr. Sonya J. Nair, Head of the Department of English of All Saints' College. It was conducted through google Meet and was live-streamed on YouTube. The webinar was open to all the YCC members of Kerala and approximately 70 people were in attendance. The webinar began with an introduction by Ms. Kukku Xavier. She congratulated Dr T. Vinay Kumar for being elected as the national of PRCI for the second time and also for the publication of his book, *The Prize - Dive into the possibilities and impact of Public Relations*.

The chief speaker Ms. Amritha Ananthakrishnan, Development Centre Manager, L&D, Education Training and Assessment, Infosys spoke about the journey to clearing interviews and working in a corporate. An interactive session where she discussed with the audience, the various challenges faced by them when thinking about interviews. She introduced several crucial points that should be focused on while attending an interview on a corporate level. She discussed the three elements of the interview - Attitude, Aptitude and Articulation.

Attitude is about how open someone is to learning and how pleasant someone is while working and how they can "fit in" to a multicultural organisation. Aptitude is the learning facility of a person. Articulation is the ability to communicate effectively. She spoke about the advantages and disadvantages of virtual interviews and mentioned three ways to ace virtual interviews being camera ready, voice, the tone in which we communicate. Taught the audience two simple exercises to have a better texture of voice. Talked about three of the gender-specific biases – "Tight rope bias", "Sticky Floor bias" and "Prove it again bias". "The tight rope" is a bias where anything a woman says assertively is

viewed upon as being aggressive or arrogant. "Sticky floor bias" is when a job is assigned gender specifically. "Prove it again bias" is held against women for much longer than for men. It is when women have to work twice as hard to prove themselves. She also spoke about how to overcome these biases. There was a question-answer session with the resource person.

Dr T. Vinay Kumar, National President of PRCI and Ram C Menon, Director of PRCI-YCC Kerala chapter also attended the webinar and addressed the audience. It was a one and half hour session.

Webinar 3 'Ethics in Advertising' October 29th 2021

Nair, Head of the Department of English of All Saints' College. It was conducted through Google Meet and there were approximately 30 people in attendance.

Nimal C.N, Associate Professor, Management Adi Shankara Business School, Kalady spoke about how Ethics differs from person to person; Business Ethics is defined as principles and standards that determine acceptable conduct in business. Social responsibility is a business obligation to maximize its positive impact and minimize its negative impacts on society. He defined 'Advertising' and mentioned the four factors of advertising: Client, Ad Agency, Media, Target Audience and also their ethics. He explained how crossing a boundary with ethics can be misleading. Airtel 4G advertisement which was banned due to misleading information, was given as an example. The webinar was cut short due to technical difficulties. The section was an hour long.
