


ONAM CELEBRATION- 1st SEPTEMBER 2022

All Saints' College held the Onam celebration for the year "AARAVAM 2022" on the 1st of September on the college premises. The events were organized by the college union and Arts club. The inaugural ceremony was held at the college auditorium and the celebrations began with a message by our beloved Principal Prof. Reshmi. R Prasad.



The main attraction of the day was the Malayali Manka competition which was conducted in association with Manorama Online and m4marry.com. This year's pageant focussed on 'Inclusivity and Body Positivity'.





The auditorium roared to life with the vibrant performances of students. The cultural programs were kickstarted by a Kerala fusion dance which was followed by a Thiruvathira by students. 






FRESHERS' DAY – 21st NOVEMBER 2022


Thus the Christmas program of the year was presented in a glorious and peaceful manner; A better way to meet the end of a year and start another one with outstretched arms.
