



2. Freshers' Day - Esperanza 2024




Esperanza 2024 was a grand success, fostering camaraderie and excitement among students, making it a memorable start to the academic journey for the freshers.

Secretary and the National Anthem. The cultural program that followed showcased the students' immense talent and creativity, leaving the audience inspired by the performances.




























4. Constitution Day Celebration 2024






6. Christmas Celebration 2024


Venue : College campus



- 2. Group Song Performed by NCC cadets, inspiring patriotic sentiments.






- 3. Speech (Hindi) Janaki (NSS) highlighted India's democratic progress.

- 7. Dance (NSS) A cultural performance showcasing India's diverse heritage.








Honoring the Achievers

The Republic Day celebrations at All Saints' College successfully instilled democratic values, patriotism, and a collective sense of responsibility among students and faculty.


