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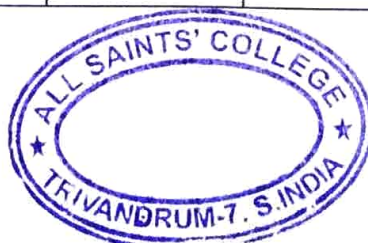
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Result Analysis 2021-22

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A program wise comparison of the results of our college with the University average reveals that the program wise pass percentage of our college is much higher than the University average (Table).

An analysis of the pass percentage reveals the adverse impact of the pandemic on the overall student performance. A sizeable section of the student community in the college belong to the coastal area and from disadvantaged communities. Students from remote areas faced network issues during the initial stages of the online classes. Lack of direct interaction with teachers in the classroom also affected the overall performance of the students.

The IQAC has analyzed the results and has given corrective measures to improve results through remedial coaching.



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
