Online Training in Digital Journalism by Reuters and Meta

Introduction

The Department of English at All Saints' College organized a pioneering **Online Training Program in Digital Journalism** in collaboration with **Reuters and Meta** from **September 1 to 10, 2024**. This **30-hour, 10-day course** aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding of the tools, ethics, and strategies essential in today's digital journalism landscape.

Coordinated by Dr. Sonya J. Nair, Head of the Department of English, and enriched by the expertise of professionals from Reuters and Meta, the course featured five meticulously designed modules. These modules explored various aspects of digital journalism, focusing on the art of storytelling in a digital age, the nuances of verification, ethical publishing practices, resilience, and independent reporting.

This report provides an in-depth overview of the course, detailing the teaching methodology, topics covered, participant experiences, and the program's broader impact.

Modules and Detailed Daily Schedule

Day 1: September 1, 2024

Module 1: Digital Newsgathering

- **Topics Covered:**

- Understanding the Reach of Social Media
- Searching Social Media Platforms for News
- Breaking News vs. Long-term Investigations

Session Details:

The inaugural session set the stage by addressing how social media platforms serve as vital tools for journalists. Trainers illustrated how real-time updates can be sourced and validated to distinguish between breaking news and long-term investigative stories. Through case studies, participants analyzed how platforms like Twitter, Instagram, and Facebook have influenced news dissemination and credibility.

Learning Outcome:

Participants learned to optimize their use of social media for journalistic purposes while identifying its limitations and pitfalls.

Day 2: September 2, 2024

Module 1 (continued): Digital Newsgathering

- **Topics Covered:**



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- Reaching Out to Sources
- Online Etiquette and Professional Communication
- Keeping Records of Digital Interactions

Session Details:

This session emphasized the importance of building trustworthy relationships with sources in the digital space. Trainers conducted interactive exercises on crafting professional communication with sources and maintaining comprehensive digital records to ensure accuracy and accountability.

Learning Outcome:

Participants gained skills in ethical digital engagement and learned techniques to document interactions effectively.

Day 3: September 3, 2024

Module 2: Verification and Reporting

● **Topics Covered:**

- Verifying the Source and Content
- Tools for Verification
- Building a Case with Evidence

Session Details:

A critical session on credibility, trainers from Reuters introduced advanced verification tools such as reverse image searches and metadata analysis. Participants practiced verifying content using sample datasets and were guided on developing a solid workflow for investigative reporting.

Learning Outcome:

Participants became adept at identifying reliable sources and debunking misinformation with practical tools and techniques.

Day 4: September 4, 2024

Module 2 (continued): Verification and Reporting

● **Topics Covered:**

- Sending Raw Files and Copyright/Fair Use Practices
- Types of Media Manipulation
- Remote Interviewing Skills and Field Skills

Session Details:

This session delved deeper into ethical reporting by focusing on copyright, fair use, and the complexities of media manipulation. Trainers demonstrated methods to identify edited content and conducted mock interviews to teach effective remote interviewing skills.




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Learning Outcome:

Participants gained a robust understanding of copyright laws and ethical guidelines while mastering the skills needed for remote and field interviews.

Day 5: September 5, 2024**Module 3: Publishing Effectively on Social Media**

- **Topics Covered:**

- Major Social Media Platforms for Journalists
- Best Practices for Digital Video
- Stopping the Spread of Misinformation

Session Details:

Participants were introduced to platform-specific strategies for creating impactful content on platforms such as YouTube, Instagram, and TikTok. Trainers emphasized video production techniques, highlighting how journalists can counter misinformation through credible reporting.

Learning Outcome:

Participants learned to optimize their content for different platforms and understood how to actively counter misinformation in their digital outputs.

Day 6: September 6, 2024**Module 3 (continued): Publishing Effectively on Social Media**

- **Topics Covered:**

- Setting a Publishing Schedule
- Choosing Images and Using Analytics Tools
- Understanding Platform Policies

Session Details:

This session highlighted the importance of creating and adhering to a publishing schedule for consistent audience engagement. Participants were trained in image selection and the use of analytics tools like Google Analytics and platform-specific insights to measure reach and impact.

Learning Outcome:

Participants gained practical skills in managing digital content strategies while adhering to platform policies.

Day 7: September 7, 2024**Module 4: Wellness and Resilience**

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- Online Attacks, Harassment, and Threats
- Responding to Trolls and Handling Violent Content
- Self-Care and Managing Vicarious Trauma

Session Details:

This emotionally charged session explored the challenges journalists face in the digital era. Trainers provided strategies to address harassment, including actionable steps for dealing with online trolls and managing exposure to violent content.

Learning Outcome:

Participants were equipped with tools and techniques to safeguard their mental health while maintaining professional resilience.

Day 8: September 8, 2024

Module 4 (continued): Wellness and Resilience

● **Topics Covered:**

- Responding to Vicarious Trauma
- Self-Care Strategies for Journalists
- Effective Work-from-Home Practices

Session Details:

The session built upon the previous day by focusing on long-term self-care strategies. Trainers emphasized the importance of balancing personal well-being with professional commitments, particularly in remote work scenarios.

Learning Outcome:

Participants were empowered with actionable self-care routines and strategies to mitigate the psychological toll of challenging assignments.

Day 9: September 9, 2024

Module 5: Operating as Independent Media in a Turbulent World

- The Why and How of Independent News
- Avoiding Bias and Ensuring Visual Integrity
- The Importance of Sources and Correcting Mistakes

Session Details:

Trainers underscored the value of independent journalism and its critical role in a democratic society. Through interactive discussions and case studies, participants learned about the dangers of bias, the importance of source vetting, and the steps for transparent corrections.




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Learning Outcome:

Participants developed an understanding of ethical standards that uphold the credibility of independent journalism.

Day 10: September 10, 2024

Module 5 (continued): Operating as Independent Media in a Turbulent World

- Dealing with Authorities
- Journalist Safety Practices
- Correcting Mistakes and Building Trust

Session Details:

The final session focused on practical measures for ensuring safety and integrity in the field. Trainers provided guidance on engaging with authorities and maintaining professional standards under scrutiny.

Learning Outcome:

Participants left the program with a holistic view of independent journalism, prepared to navigate the challenges of reporting in a turbulent world.

Impact and Feedback

Participants lauded the program for its:

- **Expert-Led Curriculum:** Insights from Reuters and Meta trainers made the sessions engaging and practical.
- **Hands-On Training:** Assignments and real-world scenarios enhanced practical learning.
- **Focus on Resilience:** Dedicated modules on self-care and harassment prepared participants for professional challenges.

The course concluded with participants presenting their final projects, receiving personalized feedback, and a virtual certificate distribution ceremony.

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


