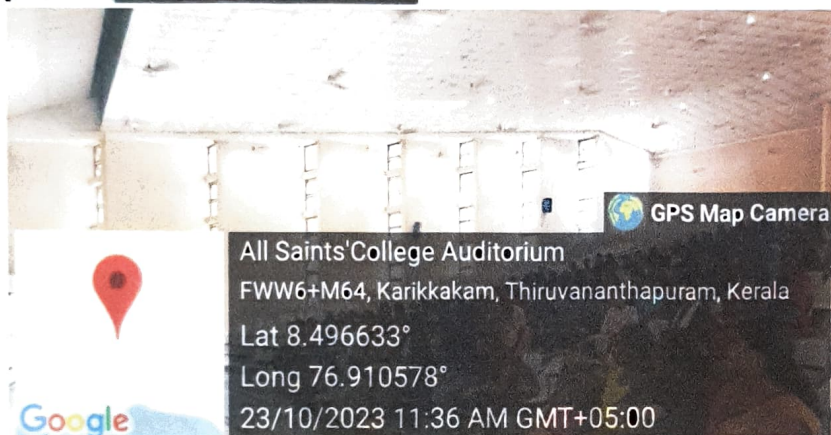

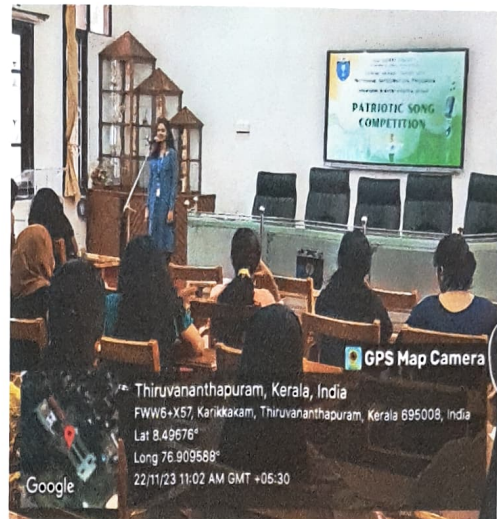
### Talk on Ethics & Values for Students

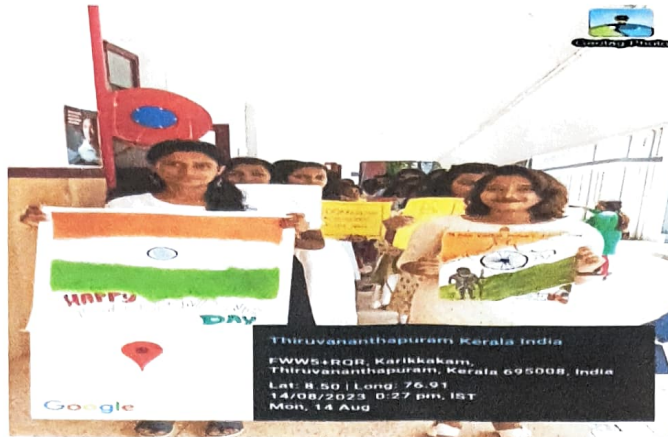


### Gandhian Study cell

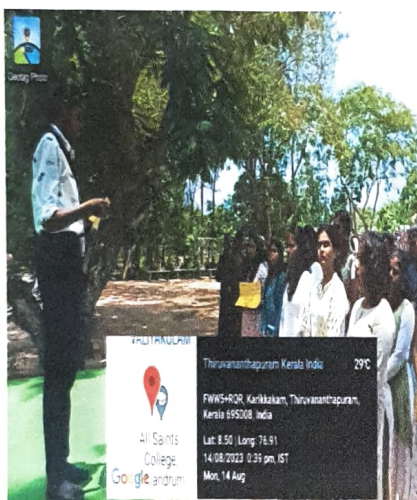
